

How libraries can help -

Severely Sight Impaired and Sight Impaired

Receive a free exempt library card which allows you to borrow books for six weeks with no late fines. Ask at any Kent library for more details

Audio books can be borrowed free of charge

e-Books, e-Audiobooks, e-Magazines & e-Newspapers are free to download

Large Print books are available in all libraries

Bag Books - multi sensory books available across the county

Advice and support on obtaining alternative formats

PenFriends – reads the information on the back of our spoken word CDs, allowing you to browse and choose your reads independently. Available in some of our libraries, ask at your local library for more details

Free computer access for two hours every day in any of our libraries (under 16s need parental permission to use the internet)

Accessibility software available on all public computers including reading, writing and visual support. Volunteer IT Buddies available to lend a helping hand

Free black and white printing and photocopying – up to 20 pages per day

Visit www.kent.gov.uk/libs to find and reserve a Kent library book (free for all Kent items – charges will apply for out of county stock), renew your books and lots more

Free audio book postal service available for severely sight impaired and sight impaired adults and young people

Got a question and can't get to the library? Then contact our *Ask a Kent Librarian* by phone, email or chat. Available 24/7, 7 days a week

Visual Impaired Book Groups meet across the county. Ask at any Kent library for more details

Booktouch - packs are provided free to parents or carers of blind or partially sighted children up to (and including) the age of five.
