Connect to Work – Supporting people into employment across Kent and Medway

Connect to Work is a voluntary employment support programme launched by the UK Government as part of the Get Britain Working Strategy. It's designed to help people who face barriers to employment – such as health conditions, disabilities, or long-term unemployment – find and stay in meaningful work.

Whether someone is unemployed or at risk of leaving their job, the programme offers up to 12 months of personalised, one-to-one support.

Connect to Work helps people succeed, on their terms. From vocational profiling and job matching to in-work support and career development, Connect to Work focuses on what matters to each individual, and works closely with employers to create inclusive opportunities.

Connect to Work:

- Is a voluntary programme supporting people into work and helping them stay in work
- Is for individuals with long-term health conditions, disabilities, and other barriers
- Provides up to 12 months of personalised, one-to-one support
- Offers support for both job seekers and those at risk of leaving work
- Incorporates two nationally recognised models: IPS and SEQF
- Integrates with health, care, and community services



- Is free for participants, employers, or referrers
- Helps people build confidence, skills, and independence
- Creates inclusive workplaces and stronger communities
- Works in partnership with local organisations to reach people who need help the most

What is included?



- 1. Personalised Support

 Tailored, one-to-one help
 from employment specialists
 who understand your unique
 challenges and strengths.
- 2. Health & Wellbeing Focus
 The programme connects
 employment with health
 and skills support, working
 closely to understand needs
 and challenges and helping
 employers get the best from
 participants they employ.
- Skills Development
 Gain access to training, upskilling opportunities, and local services that boost your confidence and employability.

- 4. Local Opportunities

 Delivered through local authorities, the programme is shaped around your community's needs understanding where to access support for participants and matching employment needs with skilled and motivated individuals.
- 5. Voluntary & Empowering
 You choose to take part.
 There's no pressure, just
 support to help you move
 forward at your own pace.

Who is eligible:

- People with disabilities or long-term health conditions
- · Offenders/ex-offenders
- · Carers/ex-carers
- · Homeless people
- Armed Forces veterans/ current AF personnel
- People with drug or alcohol dependencies/history of dependency presenting a barrier to employment
- Care experienced young people/care leavers
- Refugees (resettled Afghans/ people on the Ukrainian scheme)
- · Victims/survivors of domestic abuse
- Young people involved in or at risk of serious violence
- · Victims of modern slavery
