 - o Babies and children can have their own library card
 - No late fines on books borrowed by children and young people under the age of 18 years
 - No damages charged on books borrowed for children under five
 - with free family activities in many of them, including Rhyme Times, Storytimes and Homework Clubs
 - Children and young people (under 18s) using our computers for their homework can have up to 5 sheets of free printing per day too
 - Missed out on your Bookstart Pack? Collect it at your local library
- Free Computers with free secure internet access printing and scanning facilities
 are available in all our libraries with free access to a range of office software and the
 internet. Search for the information and support that you need without worrying about
 your internet activities being monitored
